

2 Full Day Schedules

This schedule is designed for the same reasons as the 3 Full Day schedule. However, in case, there are families who want to do the majority of their schooling at home, this is a template to help. There are families who have more flexible time, want to have the camaraderie and support of coming together with other families, but spend most of their time schooling at home. This model is known as a coop in Homeschool. Many coops meet together in their homes, taking turns. Some meet in a church. This schedule is very comparable to that model.

If your team chose this model, you would choose which of the two days work best for you. In this schedule, it could look something like the one provided here. You are going to be teaching Math and Language Arts 5 mornings a week, whether you are meeting at home or at the school. You will be teaching Science and History and Bible 3 days a week. You would schedule art, music, and PE as it works for your family schedule.

- Note: In the provided schedule history it taught 3 days at home and science in school 2 days a week. You can always reverse those subjects if it is easier to do science at home and history in school. You can always add an extra science or history at home or at school.
- Suggestion: Prepare a spiral notebook with the schedule, names, phone numbers in case of emergency, print outs from the Grad & Go Tips and Tools. These can provide help-at-a-glance for what works in homework and works in teaching. Be sure to have first aide and an emergency kit handy.

- The after lunch “Read aloud” is a favorite of experienced teacher to help the students return quietly to the classroom after lunch. Low light, and the teacher reading aloud a book to their group of students. It’s a nice quiet time for all, including the teacher. The rule of thumb is to read a few grades above their grade level. This is a fun way for them to increase vocabulary and hear more complicated language.
- Ideas for Recess/PE if there is no playground or equipment: If available, a section of the parking lot can be used for dodge ball, four-square ball. Playground balls are soft, but durable. Jump ropes can be used for all kinds of activities, including learning to “skip-count”, counting by 2’s, 3’s, etc. while skipping. This is extremely helpful in learning multiplication. Tag is always a favorite.
- Ways to provide excellent art, music, and PE:

Go to museums

Go to concerts

Take art lessons in the community

Take music lessons in the community

Become involved in youth sports

Go to the library and get books on art, music, and sports and write reports
